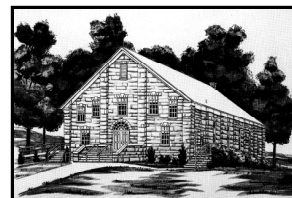


Missionaries of the Month: Richard and Elsie Bowman in Albania.
