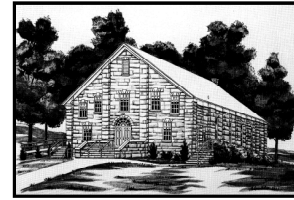

Just released by Princeton University Press, *Chosen Nation* explores the how the global Mennonite church developed an uneasy relationship with Germany during the nineteenth and twentieth centuries. Despite the religion's origins in the Swiss and Dutch Reformation, as well as its longstanding pacifism, tens of thousands of members embraced militarist German nationalism. *Chosen Nation* is a sweeping history of this encounter and the debates it sparked among parliaments, dictatorships, and congregations across Eurasia and the Americas.

Saulo Padilla is coming to Virginia Mennonite Conference Assembly in Harrisonburg, Va., as we look at "**Neighbors: Strangers No More.**" Join us July 20-22 at Park View Mennonite Church. A Pastors' Summit for credentialed leaders will be the afternoon of Thursday, July 20, with an evening meal sponsored by Everence. Conference Assembly begins on the evening of July 20 at 7 p.m. Saulo's passion to work with immigrants comes from his own experience as an immigrant and the biblical commandment to love the stranger. Now the US Immigration Education Coordinator for Mennonite Central Committee, he provides learning opportunities to constituents and the public about the need for better and safer mechanisms for people facing migration, the biblical call to welcome strangers, and advocates to reform the US immigration system.
